






Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.

Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.









Before Beginning Assembly:






- Read instructions, cover to cover.

- Do not assemble on flooring or carpet.







Assembly steps



This Table has multiple parts and may require up to 15 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Table parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.




Unpack and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.



With assistance from your adult partners, carefully place the Table Top (A) facedown on a clean, non-marring surface.

- 2.1 Attach the First Legs (B) in the positon labelled B of the Table Top (A) using Screws (1) and the Allen Wrench (3) as shown above.
- 2.2 Attach the Second Legs (C) in the positon labelled C of the Table Top (A) using Screws (1) and the Allen Wrench (3) as shown above.

DO NOT FULLY TIGHTHEN THE SCREWS.




Attach the Support Leg (D) to the assembled parts in step 2 using Screws ((2)) and the Allen Wrench ((3)) as shown above.

Repeat the same process with the remain Support Leg (D).

DO NOT FULLY TIGHTEN SCREWS.





Turn the Table right side up.

EXERT pressure, floorwards, onto the Table.

This pressure will help the Legs and Table Top reach alignment at all joints. Check for wobbles.

In a sequential manner, gradually tighten all Screws until evenly secured. Inspect the Table and make sure all parts are adequately connected.

Your Table is ready for use.

This Table can only be used on a flat, level surface.







Unpack and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.




Place the Back Support Bar (C) and Front Support Bar (D) in an botton position of Frame Wicker (E) as shown in the picture above,

using the Allen Wrenches (6) to turn the Bolts (3) into the washer 4 and L-Bracket 5.

Do not fully tighten the Bolts at this time.

Step 3




Place Right Arm Panel (A) onto the assembled frame from Step 2

Step 3.1: Align the dowels of Support Bar (C) into the positions in the Right Arm Panel (A).

Then, affix Support Bar (C) with Right Arm Panel (A) by using Bolt (1) and Allen (6).

Step 3.2: Attach the Right Arm Panel (A) onto Front Support Bar (D) by using Bolts (1) and Allen (6). DO NOT FULLY TIGHTHEN BOLTS.




Place Left Arm Panel (B) onto the assembled frame from Step 3

Step 4.1: Align the dowels of Support Bar (C) into the positions in the Left Arm Panel (B).


Then, affix Support Bar (C) with Left Arm Panel (B) by using Bolt (1) and Allen (6).

Step 4.2: Attach the Left Arm Panel (B) onto Front Support Bar (D) by using Bolts (1) and Allen (6). DO NOT FULLY TIGHTHEN BOLTS.



Place Right Arm Panel (A) and Left Arm Panel (B) onto the assembled frame from Step 4, using the Allen Wrenches (6) to turn the Bolts (3) into the washer 4 and L-Bracket 5.


Do not fully tighten the Bolts at this time.



Inspect the Chair and make sure all parts are adequately connected.

In a sequential manner, tighten all Screws and Bolts at all joints.

With assistance from your adult partners, adjust the Levelers to desired height to avoid wobbles.



Turn the Chair right side up.

Place Pillow (F) to Frame Wicker E

Inspect the Chair and make sure all parts are adequately connected.

The Chair is ready to be used.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals. Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

- What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list? The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.
- What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
